The top end of the one and half year ewes presented in very good order and sold accordingly, with many pens going to repeat buyers. But the grown ewes tailed off, showing a tough season with too much pasture growth and buyers were a bit reluctant to pay too much for them.

There were some very good runs of ewe lambs and a premium was paid for the shorn lambs. The woolly lambs were also in reasonable condition, but buyers were reluctant to buy lambs that needed shearing and prices paid reflected the current store market.
